



## English Language - Secondary

### My choices

\*In addition to the pictures shown by your teacher, you can conduct some searches on the Web or in a book to get more inspiration.

1) An animal from the North. (Examples: caribou, seal, walrus, beluga, lemming, goose, ptarmigan, wolf, fox, arctic hare, trout, etc.). Find specific characteristics related to this animal which will help you enrich your story. (For instance: the ptarmigan cannot fly very high; your story could include a ptarmigan who flew higher and further than all the others.)

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2) A well defined principal character. (Example: a grandmother. A flowered scarf covers her grey hair and she wears large clothes. She seems to suffer from her bent back. Her pace is slow. She can barely see and she is rather quiet. She is a nice, patient and generous person.) You can write short sentences like in the example or make a list of characteristics. Try to find some objectives for your character. (Example: Although she is quite old and her vision is impaired, the grandmother decides to fish for the biggest arctic char one could find in the river, all by herself.)

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3- Two secondary, well defined characters. Draw up a list of characteristics for each of them and determine their roles in your story.

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4- An object (tool, utensil or other). (Examples: a harpoon, a knife, a lamp, a doll, a piece of clothing, etc.)

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5- A season.

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6- A principal action around which your story will be created. (Examples: hunting, fishing, building an igloo or setting up a tent, playing, eating, hiding or stealing something, swimming, sliding, etc.)

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
